### **Trinity 4 / Lammas Day**

### The 1st Reading - Leviticus 23:9-14

<sup>9</sup>The Lord spoke to Moses: <sup>10</sup>Speak to the people of Israel and say to them: When you enter the land that I am giving you and you reap its harvest, you shall bring the sheaf of the first fruits of your harvest to the priest. <sup>11</sup>He shall raise the sheaf before the Lord, so that you may find acceptance; on the day after the sabbath the priest shall raise it. <sup>12</sup>On the day when you raise the sheaf, you shall offer a lamb a year old, without blemish, as a burntoffering to the Lord. <sup>13</sup>And the grain-offering with it shall be two-tenths of an ephah of choice flour mixed with oil, an offering by fire of pleasing odour to the Lord; and the drinkoffering with it shall be of wine, one-fourth of a hin. <sup>14</sup>You shall eat no bread or parched grain or fresh ears until that very day, until you have brought the offering of your God: it is a statute for ever throughout your generations in all your settlements.

### The 2nd Reading - Matthew 15:32-39

Then Jesus called his disciples to him and said, 'I have compassion for the crowd, because they have been with me now for three days and have nothing to eat; and I do not want to send them away hungry, for they might faint on the way.' The disciples said to him, 'Where are we to get enough bread in the desert to feed so great a crowd?' Jesus asked them, 'How many loaves have you?' They said, 'Seven, and a few small fish.' Then ordering the crowd to sit down on the ground, he took the seven loaves and the fish; and after aiving thanks he broke them and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And all of them ate and were filled; and they took up the broken pieces left over, seven baskets full. Those who had eaten were four thousand men, besides women and children. After sending away the crowds, he got into the boat and went to the region of Magadan.
